Learning Café Notes from participants - May 28, 2008 Albert Scott Recreation Centre

Group 1

- 1 Controversy is good, means people know about it and care how it's done. Doubts may not dissipate until up and running. Change can be hard.
- 2 Accessible to everyone by including elders, children, and people with disabilities.
- 3 Centralized: people often stop at one place and if they had to go somewhere else, they may not go any further. Collaboration interaction would be easier.
- 4 It's good now but more programs could be possible if in a centralized space that brings people together.
- 5 I think that having all the services in one roof would be a benefit.
- 6 Integrated services: students take part in delivering services that would build up their skills, abilities, and experience.
- History of Scott collegiate worries about destruction. Important to keep heritage of building in the community: the centerpiece of the community, need to keep some to remember: soul of people there. In the last 4 years, Scott rebounding, attendance, stronger in sports, etc. make building stronger and more useable and it will make the community stronger.
- 8 My kids all attended Scott, very involved in school.
- 9 Concern: too many businesses in this and pushing Scott coll. out!!
- 10 Change. In years to come, building may change. Adaptable with changes in the community, respond to community needs. Flexible so changes be possible without a lot of construction/\$.

- 1 Bring in other rental office opportunity, private enterprise. May see as competition, need to see what political climate is. Can look for or approach particular business that fit and meet needs.
- 2 Has HRSD, been involved/approached/interested?
- 3 Most partners have a security check for staff. Concerns are for indivisibles not staff in open concept. How will everyone's colour be reflected? Multiculturalism reflected in design. Possibly pick a common theme instead of books> want to reflect all in one.
- 4 Ensure seniors are involved in planning
- 5 Senior housing if possible.
- 6 Area has a bad name-I don't really know why my kids all turned out really well. I don't see all the negatives people talk about.
- 7 Kitchen/cooking components> learning kitchens and be open for community to be a part of it. Cafe connected. Kids work in it, sell, etc. In house mentoring some need life skills first, others are ready to work and learn.
- 8 Kids cooking classes integrated with gardens.
- 9 Concern: tearing Scott down, clay bank brick, (historic brick, salvage), heritage people want to re-use brick (manufacture here in SK).
- 10 Partner with SK Energy to build a solar-heated year round green house.
- 11 Underground parking lot> just as safe as any other lot and minimize the amount of disruption in neighborhood street parking. Would feel safer> like the idea of having underground parking available or offsite.

- 12 Adult: education component is important.
- 13 Community gardens: rooftop garden. Something that doesn't need a huge amount of soil (weight). Partnership with REACH. Need food storage area. Food sustainability projects. Farmers market, etc.
- 14 Develop jobs for community garden.
- 15 It's easier to force everyone thru one door. Safe/security, but make it a welcoming vision from all sides.
- 16 Security: need to work with or adjust policy. Police should check everyone who comes in regularly.

- 1 Don't feel police station or probation office. Drug rehab facilities should be connected to a school facility. "Positive role models", let not label the youth by saying they need these services.
- 2 Reuse gym auditorium and older brick. Reconstruct portion of faÁade.
- 3 Reuse interior portion of Scott Collegiate, such as s wood banister, display case, and woodwork.
- 4 Keep the old school. Renovate and add building adjacent to house facilities. Kids can use facility and still have an old school, (small, and quiet atmosphere)
- 5 Put out a call to alumni to collect old banners, memorable to display.
- 6 Pride from things that came before. Save "Scott Collegiate "piece, save bricks and flooring (old marble), and save some and use artistically.
- 7 Engrave an Alumni brick. Raise funds and encourage ownership and participation.
- 8 Sectors coming into partnership need to adjust their policies to reduce turf issuescommunity partnerships are most important. Mesh needs and opportunity.
- 9 Work on pride and personal ownership.
- 10 Promote as a new start, best in Canada. So many people went here so contact and engage as much as possible.
- 11 I am so glad to hear that you are going to keep it and rejuvenator.
- 12 Sports also important as well as arts and culture.
- 13 Needs to redo the landscaping to be welcoming. Can develop an alumni garden.
- 14 Primary health services can be a key to bring people in and may tie into other services such as counseling.

- 1 Hats off to all the people doing this project.:)
- 2 Respect the multi-cultures that exist.
- 3 Can something old (such as the old brick facade) from the Scott be reflected in the design?
- 4 The color orange has meaning particular to Scott.
- 5 Outside people have a broader interest in the environment.
- 6 There shouldn't be any closure during construction and continue the present services.
- 7 Do what is best for the community. New ideas from people who live in the community.
- 8 Auditorium: maximize the space for activities such as dance and drama.

- 1 "More needle boxes needed?
- 2 When will this start? Target a specific date
- 3 What are there for any night programs?
- 4 After hrs services.
- 5 Everything is so very fragmented. If it were all in one place, people wouldn't get so frustrated.

Group 6

- 1 How will services be able to accommodate students?

- 9 A facade is not enough, adaptive reuse is of value. Cultural symbol.

- 9 Kitchen staff felt in the dark about what is happening today.
- 10 Concerns about delivering Canada post to inform residents. Still not setting out the message.
- 11 High school and services don't belong together. School by it self is a great idea.
- 12 Excited about the project.
